THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

Throughout the month of NOVEMBER we recommend to God the souls in purgatory that He may soon bring them to His Glory, especially those of our relatives, friends and enemies and those we are bound to pray for. Mass Offering envelopes will be available at the entrance of the Church. Your intentions are remembered at daily Mass throughout November. Please place your envelopes in front of the Altar at the place provided.

November is a special time to remember to pray for the dead. In the Catholic Church, the month of November is illuminated in a special way by the mystery of the communion of saints, which refers to the union between Christians and the mutual help we can give one another.

The communion of saints explicitly links those of us still on earth, those who are already sure of Heaven but are being purified of the remains of sin in Purgatory before they come to God and those who intercede for us before the Blessed Trinity, in whom they rejoice for ever. Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness. St Josemaría had a special friendship with the Holy Souls, and used to say, "The Holy Souls in Purgatory are my good friends." The Holy Souls in Purgatory. Out of charity, out of justice, and out of excusable selfishness — they have such power with God! — remember them often in your sacrifices and in your prayers.

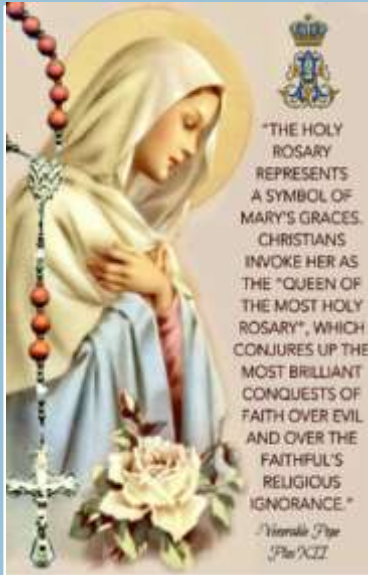

Pope Francis' invitation

The Holy Father has decided to invite all the faithful, of all the world, to pray the Holy Rosary every day, during the entire Marian month of October, and thus to join in communion and in penitence, as the people of God, in asking the Holy Mother of God and Saint Michael Archangel to protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other.

In recent days, before his departure for the Baltic States, the Holy Father met with Fr. Frédéric Fornos, S.J., international director of the World Network of Prayer for the Pope, and asked him to spread this appeal to all the faithful throughout the world, inviting them to conclude the recitation of the Rosary with the ancient invocation "Sub Tuum Praesidium", and with the prayer to Saint Michael Archangel that he protect us and help us in the struggle against evil

The prayer – the Pontiff affirmed, in a homily at Santa Marta, citing the first book of Job – is the weapon against the Great Accuser who "goes around the world seeking to accuse". Only prayer can defeat him.

We fly to thy protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin.

Changes to the Collects in the Roman Missal On 13 May 2020, Cardinal Robert Sarah, Prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, wrote to Episcopal Conferences in relation to a change to the Trinitarian conclusion to the collects (opening prayers) in the Roman Missal (2010). The omission of the word "one" before God will mean that the three possible conclusions to the collects (as outlined in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (2012), n,54) will read as follows:

*Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever.*

Following advice from the Bishops Commission for Liturgy, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference approved the change to the Trinitarian conclusions to the collect prayers in the Roman Missal. The change will take effect from the First Sunday of Advent, 29 November 2020.

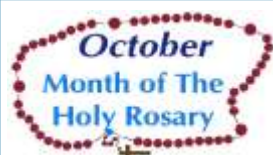
