Baptism of the Lord



Jesus didn't need to be cleansed by baptism. When Jesus says he is undergoing baptism "to fulfil all righteousness" he might mean that he is simply observing the Mosaic Law and the practices linked to a good Jewish life. "Christ is baptized," says St. Maximus, "not that he may be sanctified in the waters, but that he himself may sanctify the waters... When the Saviour is washed, then already for our baptism all water is cleansed."

Christ's humility in receiving baptism provides a model for his ministry. Like the Suffering Servant who refrains from "crying out", Jesus will accomplish his mission modestly and often quietly. He prefers to lead people gently toward an interior transformation, rather than goad them into external conformity. Our Lord knows the heart of man and realizes that crucial decisions are best made in relative calm. And this includes the decision to convert.

The Spirit of God which hovered over the waters at creation now hovers over the waters made new by their contact with God-made-man. Jesus' appearance marks a new beginning for the world, just as his arrival in individual lives brings hope of a fresh start.

The descent of the Holy Spirit at the Jordan River signals that Jesus is the Messiah. Jesus was conceived of the Holy Spirit and carries out his mission in the communion with the Third Person of the Trinity. The communion is a happy one. "At that very moment he rejoiced in the Holy Spirit..." (Luke 10:21). The Spirit remains a protagonist in baptism; a sacrament that the Lord affirms is necessary for salvation. "No one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit" (John 3:5). The Church doesn't know of any means other than baptism that assures entry into eternal beatitude. But while God has bound salvation to baptism, he himself is not bound by his sacraments.

Baptism brings about death to sin and entry into the life of the Trinity through configuration to the paschal mystery of Christ. In Isaiah we read that the Lord sends his messenger "to open the eyes of the blind." People must first admit their blindness, in order for the Messiah to work his wonders. "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you are saying 'We see,' so your sin remains" (John 9:41).

Catechesis: The Church upholds the necessity of baptism (CCC, 1257). It entrusts to God's mercy those children who die without baptism (CCC, 1261). The key effects of the sacrament are purification from sin and new birth in the Holy Spirit (CCC, 1262).
