The table of fellowship

Sitting together for a meal can generate a special feeling of togetherness. Each of us will have our own memories of table companionship or fellowship. Many of these will be happy experiences of celebration and laughter, of love received and shared. Some memories of table fellowship may be sad, times when we were more aware of one who was absent than of those who were present. Jesus shared table many times with his disciples. he also shared with them his vision of God's kingdom. At table, the disciples imbibed something of Jesus' mind and heart and spirit. The meal that stayed in their memory was the last supper. In giving himself in the bread and wine of the meal, he was to be their food and drink. He was asking them to give themselves to him as he was giving himself to them. It was because of that supper that we are here in this church today. Jesus intended his last supper to be a beginning rather than an end. It was the first Eucharist. Ever since that meal, the church has gathered regularly in his name, to do and say what he did and said at that last supper. Jesus continues to give himself as food and drink to us He also continues to put it up to his followers to take their stand with him living by his values, walking in his way, even if that means the cross. When we come to Mass and receive the Eucharist, we acknowledge Jesus as our bread of life, as the one who alone can satisfy our deepest hungers, that we will follow in his way and be faithful to him all our lives. Our familiarity with the Mass and the frequency with which we celebrate it can dull our senses to the full significance of what we are doing. Every time we gather for the Eucharist, we find ourselves once more in that upper room with the first disciples, and the last supper with all it signified is present again to us.

Old Church and Land use The lessee of the old church building and land, The Schools of Early Learning (SOEL), commenced on site on 24th September 2023 to refurbish and extend the old church and prepare the site for a Childcare Centre. Work has progressed well with good communication with the Mel Maria Primary School and the parish. SOEL plan to open



the centre for operations on 1st July 2024 and lease payments are payable from this date. This is an excellent result for the parish as it helps to pay the outstanding debt for the completion of the New Church. SOEL are a WA family owned and run a group of 6 Childcare centres. It has been focussing on quality Early Childhood Education and Care for 50 years. SOEL is having an Open Day on **Saturday 27th July 2024** from 10.00am to 2.00pm and invite all members of our parish community to come and explore the refurbished space.
